## What is new: A Pan-EU Train-the-trainers Programmes on Entrepreneurial Teaching benchmarking analysis

Given that Entrepreneurial training is becoming increasingly important in academia and business, entrepreneurship is a de facto interdisciplinary area that has drawn significant attention over the years with consequent a lot of different frameworks/approaches.

entreTime consortium performed a benchmarking analysis on the most relevant programmes on entrepreneurship education in Europe and North America (54 entrepreneurship training packages) to identify success factors of the different approaches, new tools, and eventual gaps.

### Bridging Design Thinking and EntreComp for Entrepreneurship Workshops: A Learning Experience

Design is commonly used in Entrepreneurship Education, however it’s capacity to support entrepreneurial competencies has not been explored sufficiently. A recent study performed an in-depth analysis of participants’ learning journeys in two early entrepreneurship events to gain a better understanding of this process and providing hints on how using EntreComp to add nuance to design interventions.
